WREC 2024 SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS



Students are selected in their senior year of high school by local guidance counselors and Cooperative personnel.

Applications will be available starting October 1, 2023, and postmarked no later then March 31, 2024.

Scholarship applications can be obtained at any local Cooperative District Office, high school guidance office or online at wrec.net.

Each Applicant Must...

- Be a high school senior and maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA.
- Be the dependent of a WREC Member.
- Be a bona-fide resident within the service area of Withlacoochee River Electric Coopertive, Inc., "WREC" for at least one year prior to December 31st.
- Plan to attend an in-state college, university or technical school full-time (minimum of 12 credit hours per semester).*
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA each semester (or higher if mandated by the institution) to maintain eligibility.

Each successful candidate will receive \$1,500.00 per semester (maximum \$12,000) for undergraduate studies. The screening and recommendation of candidates will be at the discretion of a committee designated by WREC. Application forms become available starting October 1st, at your high school guidance counselors office, any WREC District Office or online at wrec.net.
