Meet Barbara from Port Richey



Unlike many other charities, every dollar that is donated to ORU is available for distribution.



RESILIENCE AMIDST THE STORM: WREC'S RAPID RESPONSE TO HURRICANE DEBBY

On August 4th, Hurricane Debby brought significant challenges to our service area, causing both coastal and inland flooding. Despite these obstacles, WREC crews worked tirelessly to restore power to over 38,000 Members by the evening of August 5th, with only a few outages remaining. We extend our deepest gratitude to all of our employees for their exceptional dedication and hard work, and to our Members for their patience and understanding they displayed.

COOPERATION AMONG COOPERATIVES

Cooperation among Co-ops is a founding principle for WREC. When our partner Co-ops face challenges, WREC stands ready to assist. In August, Hurricane Debby caused widespread outages for our neighbors at Central Florida Electric Cooperative (CFEC). In response, WREC mobilized a team of 35 employees, including linemen, crew chiefs, mechanics, right-of-way personnel, and a line superintendent, to aid in the restoration of power for CFEC members. We are profoundly grateful for the unwavering commitment and hard work of our employees, who consistently exemplify their readiness to support others during critical times.
